

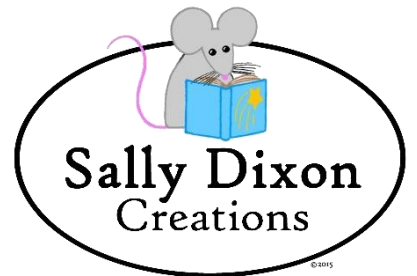
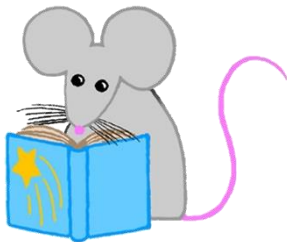
Heart Garland

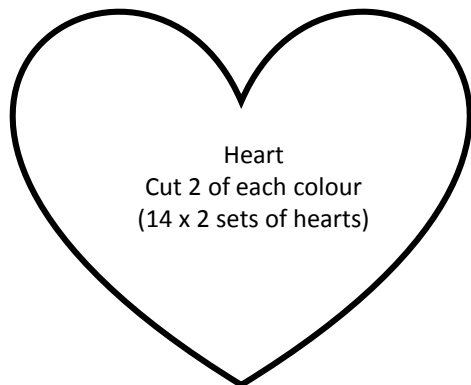

Pattern Pieces

Standard Heart

This is the one used in the photos.

Size: 6cm width by 5cm height. (2 3/8" x 2")

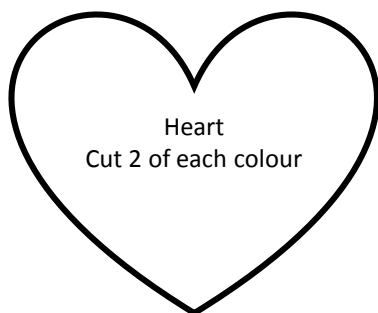


Heart

(14 x 2 sets of hearts)

Smaller Sized Heart

Included for your creative endeavours.

Size: 4.8cm width by 4cm height. (1 7/8" x 1 5/8")

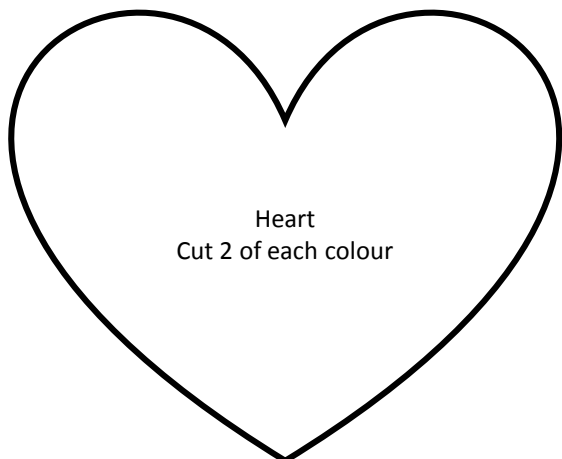


Heart

Included for your creative endeavours.

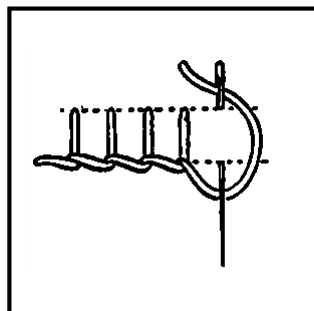
Size: 7.2cm width by 6cm height. (2 7/8" x 2 3/8")

Stitch Guide

Blanket Stitch



Materials

- Felt: various colours
- Embroidery floss: colours to match all felt
- Stuffing
- 3 metres of thin white ribbon or cord

Equipment

- Small, sharp-pointed embroidery scissors
- Sewing scissors
- Skewer (or another tool for stuffing)
- Sewing needle
- Wool needle (large enough for ribbon or cord to fit through).
- Pins
- Ruler or measuring tape

Project Instructions

Felt Hearts

1. Decide what felt colour scheme you would like to make. Cut out 14 pairs of hearts in your chosen colours. (28 hearts in total).
2. Using 2 strands of matching embroidery thread, blanket stitch around the outer edge of each pair of hearts. Before you sew all the way around, stuff with stuffing. Finish sewing and knot off.
3. Arrange the 14 hearts in the order you desire to string them.
4. Thread the ribbon or cord through the ribbon or cord.
5. Measure *at least* 25cm from the end of the ribbon or cord. Tie a knot at this point.
6. Thread the first heart using the wool need (push the needle from the left hand side, through the stuffing centre of the heart, and out through the opposite right-hand side). Push it all the way to the first knot. Tie a second knot on the opposite side of the heart so it sits securely in place.
7. Measure 7.5cm along the ribbon or cord. Tie a third knot at this point. Thread the second heart through and push it all the way to the third knot. Tie a fourth knot on the right hand side of the heart so it sits securely in place.
8. Repeat this process until all 14 hearts are strung along the garland.
9. Cut the opposite end of the ribbon or cord so it is *at least* 25cm in length.
10. String your garland wherever you desire.

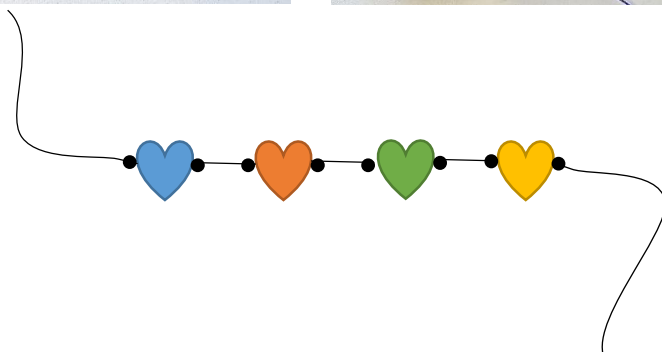

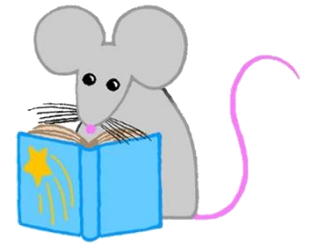
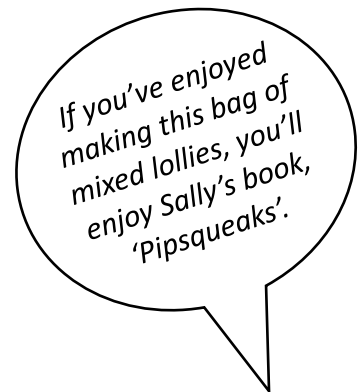
